

The Road to Renewal

In 2021, the Diocese of Buffalo embarked on a journey known as the Road to Renewal, described by Bishop Michael W. Fisher as designed to "inspire us to be a more vibrant, relevant and healing church that responds to the mission of Jesus Christ."

The faithful – priests, deacons, religious, parish administrators, laity, and school teachers within our diocese – are being called upon through the Road to Renewal to work together to reinvigorate our Catholic communities, more fully optimize parish and diocesan resources, and increase the impact of the varied ministries throughout Western New York.

As part of the Road to Renewal, St. Mary's and our parishioners have become part of a larger Family of Parishes that will share their pastor and lay leadership to increase access to Sacraments and ministries. Each parish will retain its identity while benefitting from access to additional resources as we all work together to strengthen and revitalize our faith communities, outreach, and evangelization efforts.

St. Mary's is part of the Beloved Disciples of Christ the Lord, along with Sacred Heart of Jesus (Bowmansville), Our Lady of Pompeii (Lancaster), St. Philip the Apostle (Cheektowaga), Blessed Mother Teresa of Calcutta (Depew), and St. Martha (Depew). Our six parishes began working together as a Family of Parishes in September 2022. Msgr. Richard Siepka has been named Moderator of our Family of Parishes.

History of St. Mary's

The 1800's

St. Mary of the Assumption Parish has one of the longest histories of all Roman Catholic parishes in Western New York. The parish's origins are traced to the European settlement of the area in the early 1800's. At that time, priests from St. Louis Church, Buffalo, journeyed to Lancaster to minister to settlers from Alsace and Lorraine, France.

In 1834, the Catholic Church Society of Lancaster purchased two acres of land on what came to be known as St. Mary's Hill. As a visiting priest, Fr. John Neumann (now St. John Neumann) was instrumental in the building of the first Church on the Hill, between 1837 and 1840. He also established St. Mary's first school, at the crossroads of Broadway and Transit Road. St. Mary's Cemetery precedes even the first Church structure, with graves dating back to the 1830's.

Following the establishment of the Diocese of Buffalo in 1847, Bishop John Timon formally established the parish of St. Mary of the Assumption on July 28, 1850, and the first brick Church was constructed. In 1889, the historic "bells of St. Mary's," were installed. There are three bells – named Joseph, Mary, and John – which remain in the Church's bell tower to this day. Later, in 1890, the original St. Mary's brick Church was enlarged and rededicated.

St. John's Protectory for Orphan and Wayward Boys stood on St. Mary's property for approximately two decades, beginning in the 1850's. It was then moved to Lackawanna, where it eventually became part of Fr. Baker Home.

The 1900's

In 1903, plans for a new St. Mary's School were announced. One year later, a new school building was constructed, with

education provided through high school. St. Mary's thus became the first parish high school established in the United States. By 1913, an addition to the school doubled its capacity.

In 1908, St. Mary's rectory was built. The year 1932 brought about a major renovation of the Church, and in 1936, St. Mary's stained glass windows, made in Innsbruck Austria, were installed.

The Diocese of Buffalo assumed operation of St. Mary's High School in 1955, which greatly relieved overcrowding in the parish's elementary school building.

Throughout the 1960's and 1970's, St. Mary's Faith Formation program grew steadily in size and scope. A renovation of the interior of the Church was completed in 1987, including the addition of a uniquely designed baptistery and the present marble altar and ambo.

The Twenty-First Century

The windows have undergone renovation since the early 2000's, thanks in part to funds allocated to the parish through the diocesan Upon This Rock campaign. St. Mary's Elementary continues to operate at the pre-K through 8th grade level. It is currently a STREAM site within the diocesan system. Faith Formation, too, continues as a viable part of the parish and community.

More than 170 years into its historic legacy, St. Mary of the Assumption remains a vital, vibrant faith community and an integral part of the Lancaster and Western New York community.
